

Dear Fellow Serviceman/women, Firefighters, Gold Star Mothers, and American Citizens, I would like to apologize for the mass email, but I am trying to balance every minute of my time here. I want to thank you all for your support for the Combat Wounded and the Afghan Children Programs. We have received hundreds of boxes of clothes, toys and snacks from red-blooded Americans like you. ***We are currently at max capacity*** for clothes, snacks, children's shoes, first aid supplies, blankets for kids and toys, but we will still take any donations if they are already in the mail or about to be shipped. ***Please pass the word that we can't process anymore boxes.*** As most of you know I am a simple flight medic with the USAF and my team and I provide the medi-vac for the patients to the next level of care, a flight from southern Afghanistan to the theater hospital in the northern part of the country. We are very busy flying missions, but my team of 5 personnel and I have processed over 300 boxes in 25 days with another guaranteed 700 more boxes on the way (that I know of). I was absolutely floored by all of the generosity that you all have put out. I NEVER expected the turn out that we have had. I have been deployed numerous times to a combat zone during my 18 years as a Air Force Reservist, and I have seen a lot of bad in this world, but you have proven to me that people still support the troops, no matter what, that to me is AMAZING. We have already started to transport clothes, snacks and toys throughout the country to be distributed to all of the Forward Operating Bases (FOBs). We will be set for some time to come. We have to date a total of 307 boxes received with a total postage paid to send boxes of \$3,503 and 3481 pounds of cargo has been processed and I want to take time to thank you so much for the prayers, support, kind words and most of all your generous gifts.

Thank you so much again for all that you have done for these guys who give so much and ask for nothing in return. The combat wounded and Afghan children are in a lot better shape thanks to you all.
